Meeting called to order.

The Pledge of Allegiance occurred.

Board Salutes- Metea Valley students chosen for Special Olympics Unified Football World Cup Team, NV's Literacy Pilot Program, WV Graduate to compete on Jeopardy!, Indian Prairie School District Spelling Bee, Waubonsie Valley student involvement in Cyberpatriot- National Youth Cyber Defense Competition, and SD204 students excelling at Middle School Robotics Tournament.

Public comment- 11 community members participated remotely. All speakers spoke to the decision of the School Board to continue with the policy of wearing masks in school. 6 speakers were in favor of choice and 5 speakers supported the Board decision.

Consent Agenda and Superintendent Report- Superintendent described the process used to make a recent snow day call and provided background to mask continuance decision. He also thanked various IPSD and transportation employees as well as the Naperville Police for helping address an incident that hindered the normal end of day release of students at Metea Valley, Granger and Longwood. Finally, he presented for approval Jeannie Dina to become Assistant Director of Community Relations. A motion and second were advanced and motion passed on a roll call vote of 7-0.

There were three FOIA requests that had been fulfilled.

Consent agenda- Items D-Q were approved on a roll call vote 7-0 after a motion and second. This included the adoption of a new elementary school social studies curriculum.

Consent Agenda Items for Separate Consideration- Draft Update of Accelerated Placement Program was tabled. Motion passed on a roll call vote of 7-0.

Action Items- The Approval of Gifts and Donations Report 1st Semester 21-22- Motion passed on a roll call vote of 7-0. The Approval of a Hearing Officer for Suspension Appeal. Motion passed on a roll call vote of 7-0.

Business Transacted

Discussion- A presentation was given by Executive Director, Elisha Johnson

on upcoming fundraisers for the Indian Prairie Education Foundation.

A presentation on the Transportation Information for Grandfathering Students Affected by Boundary Changes was given by Ron Johnson, Director of Support Operations.
