Updates and Reports

3.1 Riverwalk Commission

President Gibson reported that the Commission has not met since our last update, but the next meeting is scheduled for September 14th, at 7:30 a.m. at the Naperville Municipal Center lunchroom.

3.2 Finance Committee, Commissioner McBroom and Vice President Ruffing

3.3 Legislative Committee, Commissioner Thompson and Vice President Ruffing

Commissioner Thompson reported that the committee discussed the 2023-2024 IAPD/IPRA Joint Legislative Survey which serves to identify those issues relevant to park districts. A survey response is due on September 16th. The committee also discussed pending drone legislation and river access and two important grants including one to be applied toward the Brooks Crossing restoration and one from Will County to offset COVID expenses. The committee also reviewed recent meetings with local legislators and discussed future outreach opportunities.

3.4 Parks and Recreation Committee, Commissioners Ansier, Janor and Todd

Commissioner Ansier updated that the committee met just prior to tonight's regular meeting and discussed several items. Communication is being developed to inform and educate residents regarding invasive plant removal projects, starting online. It was also announced that a group is interested in donating sound equipment to the District, for use at Knoch Park ballfields. The committee received staff updates regarding the pickleball installation project at Frontier Sports

Complex, the updated timeline for the Gold Star Memorial installation anticipated for next spring, and an update regarding the Ranch View tennis courts improvements project.

The Recreation Department reported that there are two more "A Night at the Movies" events scheduled and that Centennial Beach is closed for the season but paddleboats are still running on weekends and the splash pads will remain open through the end of the month, when temperatures are at least 70 degrees. The department is also participating with the City in an outreach program for seniors to promote senior programming. The Springbrook Golf Course renovation construction is still going well, and the Parks Department continues to struggle to procure vehicles and equipment and is looking at alternative options. Bids for garbage and recycling services and contract mowing will be released soon. Marketing continues to pursue sponsorship opportunities. The committee is scheduled to meet next on October 13th.

Discussion: Commissioner McBroom expressed concern that the District could be exposed to liability based on a recent court case in Ohio that awarded damages to an employer who argued it violated their beliefs to refer to an employee by their stated gender identity. Attorney Price advised that unlike Ohio, Illinois' Equal Rights Amendment protects the right to be addressed according to a stated gender identity, at least in the workplace, interpreted in Illinois courts and evidenced in at least one recent case.

Discussion: A letter from Ms. Kelli Lord was read detailing objections to the renovations to the pickleball and basketball courts. She felt that expanding the courts would result in more consistent noise for the residents who's homes back into the complex. In response to her letter, Director Eric Shutes, Planning Director, provided additional background regarding concerns about noise levels associated with these types of courts. Staff is confident that based on similar projects, the distance from residences and the topography of Frontier Sports Complex, noise from play should not impact neighbors. After further board discussion, the consensus was to assess the noise levels after the project is completed, and consider additional noise abatement options if warranted.
